Rose and shined at 6AM today for the cruise to Klemtu. Besides Seagate and Wild Blue three other boats left about the same time, one named IMB. Being a well-traveled waterway, there

are many light stations and we've seen many along the way. One of the prettiest so far is located on Robb Point, just off Ivory Island.

Wildlife abounds here on the inside passage. The seals, otters, whales, and eagles are always there but one always needs to seekout these animals. Not so with porpoises. Three different groups have come along side the boats to greet us, although they're quick and its been difficult to capture their photo. Out of about 50 shots, Alex was able to get one good one, sans tail!
